| 4 | Whereas, the cougar is a member of the small cat family and is sometimes |
| 5 | referred to as the panther, puma, catamount, mountain lion, and painter; and |
| 6 | Whereas, an adult cougar can reach eight feet in length, including its tail, and |
| 7 | can weigh more than 150 pounds; and |
| 8 | Whereas, cougars are solitary nocturnal predators that feed primarily on deer |
| 9 | and other small mammals; and |
| 10 | Whereas, cougars were once prevalent in North Carolina, but in recent years |
| 11 | only a few sightings have been reported; and |
| 12 | Whereas, adopting the cougar as the official State cat of North Carolina |
| 13 | would help bring about awareness of this magnificent animal; Now, therefore, |
| 14 | The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: |
| 15 | SECTION 1. Chapter 145 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a |
| 16 | new section to read: |
| 17 | "§ 145-22. State cat. |

18 19 The cougar is adopted as the official State cat of the State of North Carolina." **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
