2	AN ACT TO IMPROVE THE PUBLIC HEALTH INFRASTRUCTURE BY
3	ESTABLISHING AN ACCREDITATION SYSTEM FOR LOCAL HEALTH
4	DEPARTMENTS, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE PUBLIC HEALTH TASK
5	FORCE 2004, AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO IMPLEMENT THIS ACT.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	SECTION 1.(a) G.S. 130A-2 is amended by adding the following new
8	subdivision in alphabetical order to read:
9	"§ 130A-2. Definitions.
10	The following definition shall apply throughout this Chapter unless otherwise
11	specified:

13	(01) "Accreditation board" or "Board" means the Local Health Department
14	Accreditation Board."
15	SECTION 1.(b) Part 1 of Article 2 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes
16	is amended by adding a new section to read:
17	"§ 130A-34.1. Accreditation of local health departments; board established.
18	(a) The Local Health Department Accreditation Board is established within the
19	North Carolina Institute for Public Health. The Board shall be composed of 17 members
20	appointed by the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services as follows:
21	(1) Four shall be county commissioners recommended by the North
22	Carolina Association of County Commissioners, and four shall be
23	members of a local board of health as recommended by the
24	Association of North Carolina Boards of Health.
25	(2) <u>Three local health directors.</u>
26	(3) <u>Two staff members from the Division of Public Health, Department of</u>
27	Health and Human Services.

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1	(4) One staff member from the Division of Environmental Health,
2	recommended by the Secretary of Environment and Natural Resources.
3	(5) Three at large.
4	(b) Members shall serve four-year terms except that initial terms shall be
5	staggered such that three members are appointed for one year, four members are
6	appointed for two years, four members are appointed for three years, and six members
7	are appointed for four years. An appointment to fill a vacancy on the Board created by
8	the resignation, dismissal, ineligibility, death, or disability of any member shall be made
9	for the balance of the unexpired term. The Secretary may remove any member for
10	misfeasance, malfeasance, or nonfeasance. The chair shall be designated by the
11	Secretary and shall designate the times and places at which the Board shall meet. The
12	Board shall meet as often as necessary to carry out its duty to develop and review
13	periodically accreditation standards, to engage in activities necessary to assign
14	accreditation status to local health departments, and to engage in other activities
15	necessary to implement this section.
16	(c) Members of the Board who are not officers or employees of the State shall
17	receive reimbursement for travel and subsistence expenses at the rates specified in
18	G.S. 138-5. Members of the Board who are officers or employees of the State shall
19	receive reimbursement for travel and subsistence at the rate set out in G.S. 138-6.
20	(d) The Board shall assign an accreditation status to each local health department
21	that applies for initial accreditation, reaccreditation, or relief from conditional
22	accreditation. The Board shall assign the appropriate accreditation status, as follows:
23	(1) Accredited, which means that the local health department has satisfied
24	the accreditation standards adopted by the Board and applicable rules
25	adopted by the Commission.
26	(2) Conditionally accredited, which means that the local health department
27	has failed to meet one or more accreditation standards and has
28	therefore been granted short-term accreditation subject to conditions
29	specified by the Board.
30	(3) Unaccredited, which means that the local health department has
31	continued to fail to meet one or more accreditation standards after a
32	period of conditional accreditation.
33	(e) The Commission shall, after reviewing standards developed by and
34	consulting with the Board, adopt rules establishing accreditation standards for local
35	health departments. The accreditation standards shall include at least all of the
36	following:
37	(1) An accreditation process that consists of the following components:
38	a. A self-assessment conducted by the local health department
39	seeking accreditation.
40	b. A site visit by a team of experts to clarify, verify, and amplify
41	the information in the self-assessment.
42	c. Final action by the Board on the local health department's
43	accreditation status.

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1	(2)	The local health department's capacity to provide the essential public

22	(<u>3)</u>	The local health department's facilities and administration.
23		4)	The local health department's staff competencies and training
24			procedures or programs.
25	<u>(</u>	<u>5)</u>	The local health department's governance and fiscal management; and
26		<u>6)</u>	Informal procedures for reviewing Board decisions.
27			ocal health departments shall obtain and maintain accreditation in
28			this section. The Board shall implement accreditation over a period of
29			nning January 1, 2006. The Board shall establish a schedule specifying
30			health department shall apply for initial accreditation and ensuring that
31			epartments have applied for initial accreditation by December 1, 2014.
32	<u>(g)</u> <u>1</u>	The B	oard shall assign the following accreditation status, as applicable:
33	<u>(</u>	<u>1)</u>	"Accredited" to a local health department that satisfies the
34			accreditation standards. The initial period of accreditation shall expire
35			four calendar years after initial accreditation is granted.
36	<u>(</u>	<u>2)</u>	"Conditionally accredited" to a local health department that, in its
37			initial accreditation application, fails to satisfy the accreditation
38			standards. The period of conditional accreditation shall expire two
39			calendar years after conditional accreditation is granted. The Board
40			shall provide to the local health department a written statement of the
41			conditions that must be satisfied in order for the local health
42			department to be accredited. At any time during the two-year period,
43			the local health department may request that its status be reviewed and
44			changed from "conditionally accredited" to "accredited." If the Board

finds that the conditions have been met, the Board shall change the
local health department's status to "accredited" with the accreditation
period to expire four calendar years after the conditional accreditation
was initially granted. If the Board finds that the conditions have not
been satisfied, the local health department shall continue under its
grant of conditional accreditation. During the conditional accreditation
period, the local health department may apply again for accreditation
in accordance with rules adopted by the Commission.
(h) Each accredited local health department shall apply for reaccreditation in
accordance with rules adopted by the Commission.
(i) When the Board assigns the status "unaccredited" to a local health
department, the Board shall send written notification of that status to the local health
department and to the Secretary.
(j) The Commission shall adopt rules to implement this section."
SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the
Department of Health and Human Services the sum of one million two hundred fifty
thousand dollars (\$1,250,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year. These funds shall be
allocated to the Local Health Department Accreditation Board to carry out the purposes
of this act.
SECTION 3. Section 1 of this act becomes effective October 1, 2005. The
remainder of this act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
