7	"§ 58-24-	185. E	Exemption of certain societies. <u>societies, orders, and associations.</u>
8	(a)	Nothi	ng contained in this Article shall be so construed as to affect or apply to:
9		(1)	Grand or subordinate lodges of societies, orders or associations now
10			doing business in this State which provide benefits exclusively through
11			local or subordinate lodges;
12		(2)	Orders, societies or associations which admit to membership only
13			persons engaged in one or more crafts or hazardous occupations, in the
14			same or similar lines of business, insuring only their own members and
15			their families, and the ladies' societies or ladies' auxiliaries to such
16			orders, societies or associations;
17		(3)	Domestic societies which limit their membership to employees of a
18			particular city or town, designated firm, business house or corporation
19			which provide for a death benefit of not more than five hundred dollars
20			(\$500.00) or disability benefits of not more than three hundred fifty
21			dollars (\$350.00) to any person in any one year, or both;
22		(4)	Domestic societies or associations of a purely religious, charitable or
23			benevolent description, which provide for a death benefit of not more
24			than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or for disability benefits of not
25			more than three hundred fifty dollars (\$350.00) to any one person in
26			any one year, or both; or
27		(5)	An association of local lodges of a society now doing business in this
28			State which provides death benefits not exceeding five hundred dollars
29			(\$500.00) to any one person, provided, that the Commissioner may

1	authorize the payment of death benefits not exceeding three thousand
2	dollars (\$3,000) to any one person, or may authorize disability benefits
3	not exceeding three hundred dollars (\$300.00), or may authorize both
4	payments, in any one year to any one person.
5	(6) Any association, whether a fraternal benefit society or not, which was
6	organized before 1880 and whose members are officers or enlisted,
7	regular or reserve, active, retired, or honorably discharged members of
8	the Armed Forces or Sea Services of the United States, and a principal
9	purpose of which is to provide insurance and other benefits to its
10	members and their dependents or beneficiaries.
11	(b) Any such society or association described in subsections (a)(3) or (a)(4) supra
12	which provides for death or disability benefits for which benefit certificates are issued,
13	and any such society or association included in subsection (a)(4) which has more than
14	1000 members, shall not be exempted from the provisions of this Article but shall
15	comply with all requirements thereof.
16	(c) No society which, by the provisions of this section, is exempt from the
17	requirements of this Article, except any society described in subsection (a)(2) supra,
18	shall give or allow, or promise to give or allow to any person any compensation for
19	procuring new members.
20	(d) Every society which provides for benefits in case of death or disability
21	resulting solely from accident, and which does not obligate itself to pay natural death or
22	sick benefits shall have all of the privileges and be subject to all the applicable
23	provisions and regulations of this Article except that the provisions thereof relating to
24	medical examination, valuations of benefit certificates, and incontestability, shall not
25	apply to such the society.
26	(e) The Commissioner may require from any society or association, by
27	examination or otherwise, such information as will enable the Commissioner to
28	determine whether such the society or association is exempt from the provisions of this
29	Article.
30	(f) Societies, or associations exempted under the provisions of this
31	section, section shall also be exempt from all other provisions of the general insurance
32	laws of this State."
33	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
