3	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a
5	new Article to read:

7	"Art Therapy Licensure Act.
8	" <u>§ 90-270.80B-1. Short title.</u>
9	This act shall be known and may be cited as the 'Art Therapy Certification Act.'
10	" <u>§ 90-270.80B-2. Policy and purpose.</u>
11	The General Assembly recognizes that art therapy is a profession that affects the
12	public welfare and that trained art therapists are more likely to achieve positive
13	treatment outcomes than practitioners without such training who attempt to use art in
14	the diagnosis and treatment of patients. The General Assembly further recognizes that
15	the American Art Therapy Association provides standards for education and
16	professional competence in art therapy and that an art therapist who is registered with
17	the Art Therapy Credentials Board and licensed as a professional counselor in this State
18	is qualified to use art therapy in treatment.
19	Therefore, it is the purpose of this Article to protect the public and improve mental
20	health outcomes by prohibiting unqualified practitioners from advertising themselves or
21	otherwise holding themselves out to be art therapists unless licensed in accordance with
22	the provisions of this Article.

1	(2) Submit proof that he or she is currently certified as a Registered Art
2	Therapist (ATR) by the Art Therapy Credentials Board.
	(3) Submit proof that he or she has earned a master's degree in art therapy
	from a graduate program approved by the American Art Therapy
	Association at the time of his or her graduation.
	(4) Submit the applicable fees.
	(b) The Board shall review and approve or reject all applications for licensure
	submitted to it within 90 days of receipt of the application.
	(c) When the Board intends to deny an application for licensure, it shall send the
	applicant written notice of its decision by certified mail. The notice shall include a
	statement of the reasons for the action. Within 30 days of the date that an applicant
	receives the notice, the applicant may file a petition with the Board for review of its
	preliminary decision. At the hearing, the burden shall be on the applicant to show that
	licensure should be granted. After the hearing, the Board shall affirm or reverse its
	preliminary denial.
	" <u>§ 90-270.80B-8. Temporary license.</u>
	(a) <u>Temporary licensure may be issued to a person who applies for licensure for</u>
	the first time in this State and who submits proof that he or she:
	(1) Has earned a master's degree in art therapy from a graduate program
	approved by the American Association of Art Therapists at the time of
	his or her graduation; or
	(2) <u>Has completed at least 24 graduate semester credit hours in the core art</u>
	therapy curriculum as defined by the American Art Therapy
	Association.
	(b) <u>Temporary licensure may be issued only for the purpose of allowing an</u>
	otherwise qualified applicant to practice as an art therapist until he or she has met the
	practice requirements for licensure established by the Board.
	(c) <u>Temporary licensure shall be issued upon payment of the specified fee for a</u>
	fixed period of time to be determined by the Board and shall not be renewed except by
	the Board subject to proof of good and exceptional cause shown by the applicant. [8] 90-270.80B-9. License renewal.
	(a) Licensure shall be renewable every three years upon payment of the renewal
	fee.
	(b) <u>A licensee applying for renewal of his or her license shall submit proof that</u>
	the licensee is currently registered as an art therapist by the Art Therapy Credentials
	Board.
	(c) A license that has lapsed may be reinstated upon payment of a renewal fee
	and a late renewal fee. The licensee shall not be required to pay renewal fees during the
	period the license lapsed.

	The Board shall establish fees not exceeding the following amounts:
	(1) License application \$100.00.
	(2) Triennial renewal of license \$100.00.
	(3)Late renewal of license\$50.00.

2	" <u>§ 90-270.80B-11. Disciplinary action by the Board; notice and hearing;</u>
3	reinstatement.
4	(a) The Board is authorized to deny, revoke, or suspend a license granted
5	pursuant to this Article on the following grounds:
6	(1) Denial, revocation, or suspension of the art therapist's license to
7	practice professional counseling in this State.
8	(2) Fraudulent procuring or use of a license issued under this Article.
9	(3) Occupational advertising that is intended or has a tendency to deceive
10	the public.
11	(4) Conduct that evidences unfitness to practice art therapy.
12	(b) The Board may not deny, suspend, or revoke licensure for the reasons set
13	forth in subsection (a) of this section without prior notice and opportunity for hearing.
14	Hearings shall be conducted in accordance with Article 3A of Chapter 150B of the
15	General Statutes.
16	(c) Any person whose license has been suspended or revoked may apply to the
17	Board, after not less than one year, for vacation of the suspension or reinstatement of
18	the license in accordance with rules adopted by the Board.
19	" <u>§ 90-270.80B-12. Notice of use of art therapy to be posted.</u>
20	A clinic, hospital, or other facility that uses the services of an art therapist shall post
21	a notice to that effect in a prominent place.
22	" <u>§ 90-270.80B-13. Violations; injunctive relief.</u>
23	(a) Any person who violates any provision of this Article shall be guilty of a
24	Class 1 misdemeanor and may be subject to a civil penalty of not more than one
25	thousand dollars (\$1,000).
26	(b) The Board may apply to the superior court for an order enjoining violations
27	of this Article, and upon a showing by the Board that any person has violated or is about
28	to violate this Article, the court may grant an injunction or restraining order or take
29	other appropriate action."
30	SECTION 2. Any person who submits proof to the Board that the person
31	has been actively engaged in business as an art therapist in this State for at least three
32	consecutive years before the effective date of this act and pays the required fee for the
33	issuance of a license shall be licensed without having to satisfy the requirements of
34	G.S. 90-270.80B-7, enacted by Section 1 of this act. All persons who do not make
35	application to the Board within one year of the effective date of this act shall be required
36	to complete all requirements prescribed by the Board and to otherwise comply with the
37	provisions of G.S. 90-270.80B-7.
