(2	7) Reporting Dropout Rates, Suspensions, Expulsions, and Alternative Placements. – The State Board shall report annually to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee and the Commission on Improving the Academic Achievement of Minority and At-Risk Students on the numbers of students who have dropped out of school, been suspended, been expelled, or been placed in an alternative program. The data shall be reported in a disaggregated manner and be readily available to the public. The State Board shall not include students that have been expelled from school when calculating the dropout rate. In calculating the dropout rate, the Board shall not include students who transfer to a community college before

21dropout rate. In calculating the dropout rate, the Board shall not22include students who transfer to a community college before23graduation and receive a high school diploma or its equivalent while at24community college. A student shall be considered to have dropped out25when that student voluntarily withdraws from school at age 16 or is26expelled from school and does not finish at another school.
