- (5) Include specific implementation, time line, management, performance, and reporting benchmarks; and
- (6) Include a statement of how all teachers who will be directly participating in the plan conducted a verifiable secret ballot vote, a statement that the results of the vote were presented to the planning team and local board of education prior to the local board's consideration of the final plan, and a statement that the majority of teachers participating in the plan and the school administration team have agreed on the design of the plan.

**SECTION 3.** The State Board of Education may grant waivers of laws, rules, and policies to pilot units that are necessary to implement the business plans submitted by the pilot units.

**SECTION 4.** The Financial Services Section of the Department of Public Instruction shall monitor the implementation of the business plans by the pilot units and shall report their findings regularly to the State Board of Education and the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee.

**SECTION 5.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
