## March 19, 2009 1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO MODIFY THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE SUPPLEMENTAL RETIREMENT 3 BOARD OF TRUSTEES. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 SECTION 1. G.S. 135-96 reads as rewritten: 6 "§ 135-96. Supplemental Retirement Board of Trustees. 7 The Supplemental Retirement Board of Trustees is established to administer the (a) 8 Supplemental Retirement Income Plan established under the provisions of this Article and the 9 North Carolina Public Employee Deferred Compensation Plan established under 10 G.S. 143B-426.24. 11 (b) The Board consists of nine voting members, as follows: 12 Six persons appointed by the Governor who have experience in finance and (1)investments, one of whom shall be a State employee; employee, and one of 13 14 whom shall be a retired State or local governmental employee; One person appointed by the General Assembly upon the recommendation 15 (2)of the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 16 17 One person appointed by the General Assembly upon the recommendation (3)of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate; and 18 The State Treasurer, ex officio, who shall be the Chair. 19 (4)20 (c) The initial appointments by the General Assembly and two of the Governor's initial 21 appointments shall be for one-year terms. The remainder of the initial appointments shall be for 22 two-year terms. At the expiration of these initial terms, appointments shall be for two years and 23 shall be made by the appointing authorities designated in subsection (b) of this section. A 24 member shall continue to serve until the member's successor is duly appointed, but a holdover under this provision does not affect the expiration date of the succeeding term. No member of 25 26 the Board may serve more than three consecutive two-year terms. 27 (d) Other than ex officio members, members appointed by the Governor shall serve at the Governor's pleasure. An ex officio member may designate in writing, filed with the Board, 28 29 any employee of the member's department to act at any meeting of the Board from which the 30 member is absent, to the same extent that the member could act if present in person at such 31 meeting." 32 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2009.
