6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	SECTION 1. G.S. 115D-40.1(d) reads as rewritten:
8	"§ 115D-40.1. Financial Assistance for Community College Students.
9	
10	(d) Participation in Federal Loan Programs. – All community colleges shall participate
11	in the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program. Program, unless the board of trustees of
12	an institution adopts a resolution declining to participate in the Program. The State Board shall
13	ensure that at least one counselor is available at each college to inform students about federal
14	programs and funds available to assist community college students, including, but not limited
15	to, Pell Grants, HOPE and Lifetime Learning Tax Credits, and and, for participating colleges,
16	the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program, and to actively encourage students to utilize
17	these federal programs and funds. The board of trustees of any institution that has declined to
18	participate in the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program through the adoption of a
19	resolution may rescind the resolution and participate in the Program but shall not have the
20	authority to again decline participation in the Program.
21	Any community college that participates in the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan
22	Program shall have the authority to transfer up to three percent (3%) of the State funds
23	allocated to it for faculty salaries for purposes that directly affect student services."
24	SECTION 2. The State Board of Community Colleges shall realign its funding
25	formula by increasing the amount allocated in the funding formula for curriculum and
26	continuing education instruction by eighteen million dollars (\$18,000,000) and by reducing the
27	amount in the funding formula for students' services by a commensurate amount.
28	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2011.
