BILL SUMMARY:

SB 91 extends the sunset for the e-NC Authority from December 31, 2011 to December 31, 2015.

ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:

For FY 2011- 12, the e-NC Authority has a recurring General Fund appropriation through the Commerce State-Aid budget of \$442,035. If e-NC was eliminated as of December 31, 2011, then only half a year of funding would be required and no future funds would be needed. Thus, if e-NC were allowed to sunset on December 31, 2011, there would be a savings to the State of \$221,017 in the first year and \$442,035 each year thereafter.

The extension of the sunset means that funds could still be appropriated to support the operations of e-NC through December 31, 2015, at which point funding could be eliminated. The amount of funding required by e-NC was originally established as \$500,000 annually for administration and operating. In recent years, that amount has been reduced to \$442,035 and could be subject to future reductions.

Thus, the impact of extending the e-NC Authority's sunset is variable depending on what level of funding the General Assembly determines is necessary. It would presumably be in the range of \$0 to \$442,035 annually.
