No operating standards set by the 911 Board pursuant to Article 3 of 24 Chapter 62A of the General Statutes shall be effective until January 1, 2014. January 1, 2015." 25 **SECTION 4.** The Legislative Research Commission shall study the following 26 issues and report its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly on or before 27 January 31, 2014: 28 (1) Composition of the 911 Board and appropriate placement of the 911 Board 29 within State government. 30 (2) Development of operating standards for Public Safety Answering Points 31
  - (PSAPs).
  - Development of standards for, and delivery of, training and certification for (3) telecommunicators assigned to PSAPs.
  - Consideration of "next generation" 911 service and the State's role in (4) addressing development and costs involved.
  - (5) Administration of the 911 fund.

**SECTION 5.** Section 1 of this act becomes effective December 1, 2013, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.

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
