2	AN ACT TO PROMPTLY NOTIFY LOCAL 911 CALL CENTERS OF CERTAIN		
3	INFORMATION ABOUT VEHICLES THAT HAVE BEEN TOWED.		
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
5	SECTION 1. G.S. 20-219.11 reads as rewritten:		
6	"§ 20-219.11. Notice and probable cause hearing.		
7	(a) W	henever a vehicle with a valid registration plate or registration is to	owed as
8	provided in G.S. 20-219.10, the authorizing person shall immediately notify the last known		
9	registered owner of the vehicle of the following:		
10	(1)) A description of the vehicle; vehicle.	
11	(2)) The place where the vehicle is stored; stored.	
12	(3)) The violation with which the owner is charged, if any; any.	
13	(4)) The procedure the owner must follow to have the vehicle returned	to him;
14		and the owner.	
15	(5)) The procedure the owner must follow to request a probable cause he	aring on
16		the towing.	
17	If the vehicle	has a North Carolina registration plate or registration, notice shall be give	en to the
18	owner within 24 hours; if the vehicle is not registered in this State, notice shall be given to the		
19	owner within 72 hours. This notice shall, if feasible, be given by telephone. Whether or not the		
20	owner is reached by telephone, notice shall be mailed to his last known address unless he or his		
21	agent waives this notice in writing.		
22	(a1) Whenever a vehicle is towed as provided in G.S. 20-219.10, the tower shall provide		
23	the following information to the local 911 call center prior to moving the vehicle:		
24	<u>(1)</u>	<u>A description of the vehicle.</u>	
25	(2)) The place from which the vehicle was towed.	
26	<u>(3)</u>) The place where the vehicle will be stored.	
27	<u>(4)</u>) The contact information for the person from whom the vehicle ow	ner may
28		retrieve the vehicle.	
29	The notice required under this subsection is in addition to the notice required under subsection		
30	(a) of this section. If the vehicle is impeding the flow of traffic or otherwise jeopardizing the		
31	public welfare so that immediate towing is necessary, the notice to the local 911 call center		
32	may be provided by a tower within 30 minutes of moving the vehicle rather than prior to		
33	moving the vehicle. If a caller to a local 911 call center can provide the information required		
34	under subdivisions (1) and (2) of this subsection, then a local 911 call center shall provide to		

35 the caller the information provided under subdivisions (3) and (4) of this subsection. The local



- 911 call center shall preserve the information required under this subsection for a period of not 1
- less than 30 days from the date on which the tower provided the information to the local 911
- 2 3 4 call center.
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- SECTION 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 2013.
