## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	AN ACT REQUIRING THE DIVISION OF MEDICAL ASSISTANCE OF THE		
3	DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, THE DIVISION OF PUBLIC		
4	HEALTH OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, AND THE		
5	DEPARTMENT OF THE STATE TREASURER TO COLLABORATE WITH ONE		
6	ANOTHER REGARDING ACTIVITIES AND PROGRAMS AIMED AT DIABETES		
7	PREVENTION, CONTROL, AND CARE AND TO REQUIRE A REPORT TO THE		
8	JOINT LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE ON HEALTH AND HUMAN		
9	SERVICES AND THE FISCAL RESEARCH DIVISION REGARDING THESE		
10	PROGRAMS ADDRESSING DIABETES.		
11	Whereas, approximately 1.2 million people are living with diabetes in North		
12	Carolina, accounting for 12% of the population, and the rate of diabetes is predicted to increase		
13	by 66% by 2025; and		
14	Whereas, North Carolina is ranked 42nd in the area of diabetes in the 2012		
15	American Health Rankings report; and		
16	Whereas, according to the Centers for Disease Control indicates diabetes is the		
17	leading cause of kidney failure, nontraumatic lower-limb amputations, and new cases of		
18	blindness and other chronic diseases among adults in the United States; and		
19	Whereas, chronic diseases and related injuries are responsible for approximately		
20	two-thirds of all deaths in North Carolina; therefore effective coordination and utilization of		
21	resources addressing diabetes and other chronic diseases would benefit all North Carolina		
22	residents; Now, therefore,		
23	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
24	SECTION 1. Part 3 of Article 7 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes is		
25	amended by adding a new section to read:		
26	" <u>§ 130A-221.1. Coordination of diabetes programs.</u>		
27	(a) The Division of Medical Assistance of the Department, the Diabetes Prevention and		
28	Control Branch of the Division of Public Health in the Department, and the Division in the		
29 30	Department of State Treasurer responsible for the State Health Plan for Teachers and State		
30 31	Employees shall collaborate to identify goals and benchmarks while also developing individual		
32	entity plans to reduce the incidence of diabetes in North Carolina, improve diabetes care, and control complications associated with diabetes.		
32 33	(b) The Division of Medical Assistance of the Department, the Diabetes Prevention and		
33 34	Control Branch of the Division of Public Health in the Department, the Division in the

- 36 Employees shall submit a report to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and



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	Human Services and the Fiscal Research Division by January 1 of each odd-numbered year.			
2 3	The report shall address the following matters:			
	<u>(1)</u>	The financial impact and reach that diabetes of all types is having on the		
		agency, the State, and localities. Items included in this assessment shall		
		include the number of lives with diabetes impacted by prevention and		
		diabetes control programs implemented by the agency, the financial toll or		
		impact diabetes and its complications places on the program, and the		
		financial toll or impact diabetes and its complications places on the program		
		in comparison to other chronic diseases and conditions.		
	<u>(2)</u>	An assessment of the benefits of implemented programs and activities aimed		
		at controlling diabetes and preventing the disease. This assessment shall also		
		document the amount and source for any funding directed to the agency		
		from the North Carolina General Assembly for programs and activities		
		aimed at reaching those with diabetes.		
	<u>(3)</u>	A description of the level of coordination existing between the Divisions		
		with regards to activities, programs, and messaging on managing, treating, or		
		preventing all forms of diabetes and its complications.		
	<u>(4)</u>	The development or revision of detailed action plans for battling diabetes		
		with a range of actionable items for consideration by the General Assembly.		
		The plans shall identify proposed action steps to reduce the impact of		
		diabetes, pre-diabetes, and related diabetic complications. The plans shall		
		also identify expected outcomes of the action steps proposed and establish		
		benchmarks for controlling and preventing diabetes.		
	<u>(5)</u>	The development of a detailed budget identifying needs, costs, and resources		
		required to implement the plans identified in subdivision (4) of this		
		subsection."		
	SECT	<b>FION 2.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
