4 **SECTION 2.(h)** The State Education Assistance Authority shall establish a council 5 comprised of representatives of The University of North Carolina, the North Carolina Community 6 College System, and the North Carolina Independent Colleges and Universities to guide and assist 7 the Authority in formulating, developing, and implementing any policies necessary for the proper 8 administration and maintenance of the coordinated and centralized process for determining 9 residency for tuition and State-funded financial aid as required by this act.

10 **SECTION 3.** Section 1 of this act becomes effective April 1, 2017. Section 2 of this 11 act becomes effective September 1, 2016, and applies to all undergraduate enrollments for 12 academic quarters, terms, or semesters that begin on or after January 1, 2017, and to all graduate 13 enrollments for academic quarters, terms, or semesters that begin on or after January 1, 2018. The

14 remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
