

	Whereas, the men and women who bravely serve as first responde			
	on the frontlines of homeland defense in the war against terrorism; an			
	Whereas, first responders are called upon in the event of a natural di	saster, such as		
	fatthew and the western North Carolina wild fires in 2016; and			
	Whereas, North Carolina has 504 law enforcement agencies, 24,000 p			
	51,000 firefighters, 1,600 State Troopers, and 40,500 emergency medical technicians that risl			
their lives every day to make our communities safe; and				
	Whereas, these 24,000 sworn police officers from State, tribal, city, a	-		
	enforcement agencies protect lives and property, detect and prevent crimes, uphold the law, and			
ensure justic	e; and			

Whereas, these 51,000 firefighters, both volunteer and career, provide fire
suppression, emergency medical services, search and rescue, hazardous materials response,
suspected terrorism response, and critical fire prevention and safety education; and

Whereas, the 1,600 State Troopers protect the lives and property, uphold the law,and ensure justice throughout our State; and

Whereas, the 40,500 emergency medical professionals in the State respond to and treat a variety of life-threatening emergencies, from cardiac and respiratory arrest to traumatic injuries; and

Whereas, according to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, a total of 1,649 law enforcement officers throughout our country died in the line of duty during the past 10 years, an average of one death every 53 hours or 165 per year; and

Whereas, according to the United States Fire Administration, from 1996 through 2005 over 1,500 firefighters were killed in the line of duty and tens of thousands were injured; and

Whereas, four in five medics are injured on the job, more than one in two (50%) have been assaulted by a patient, and one in two (50%) have been exposed to an infectious



1	disease; emergency medical service personnel in the United States have an estimated fatality				
2	rate of 12.7 per 100,000 workers, more than twice the national average for all occupations; and				
3	Whereas, hundreds of first responders have made the ultimate sacrifice in North				
4	Carolina; and				
5	Whereas, North Carolina's 117,100 first responders make personal sacrifices to				
6	protect our communities every day; and				
7	Whereas, in the aftermath of the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, America's				
8	firefighters, law enforcement officers, and emergency medical workers were universally				
9	recognized for the sacrifices they made on that tragic day and should be honored each year as				
10	these tragic events are remembered; and				
11	Whereas, there currently exists no national day to honor the brave men and women				
12	of the first responder community, who give so much of themselves for the sake of others; and				
13	Whereas, these men and women by their service and their dedicated efforts have				
14		ned the gratitude of the people of North Carolina; Now, therefore,
